1A. World Religions & Philosophies Lecture & Notes	Students will watch the lecture video in Google Classroom and take notes throughout; Students should also complete the Content Frame to stay organized with each belief system, dates, founders, etc.	Students will be tested over the content of the lecture during the first full week of school using both MCQ* & SAQ** assessments (Foundations to 1200 Unit Test)
1B. Primary Source Readings for World Religions & Philosophies	Students will read the primary source packet and annotate (take notes) on them	Students will be tested over the content of the primary sources during the first full week of school using both MCQ & SAQ assessments (Foundations to 1200 Unit Test)
2. World Regions Map Packet	Students will learn the different regions of the world (according to the College Board) and the major countries in each region using a map packet (<i>the map will not be turned in for a grade, but it is recommended for students to complete both the map and the content frame to prepare for the test</i>)	Students will be tested over the world regions on the World Regions Map Test (MCQ format)

3. Foundations to 1200 C.E. Lecture & Notes	Students will watch the lecture video in Google Classroom and take notes (this is basically a brief history of the world up to 1200 CE when our official curriculum begins)	Students will be tested over the content of the lecture during the first week of school using both MCQ & SAQ assessments (Foundations to 1200 Unit Test)
4. “The Meaning of Classicism” Article	Students will read the assigned article by historian Dr. Marilyn Hitchens and annotate the article to ensure comprehension	Students will be tested over the content of the article during the first week of school using both MCQ & SAQ assessments (Foundations to 1200 Unit Test)
5. Key Terms Packet for the Foundations to 1200 Unit Test	Students will need to familiarize themselves with these words and their meanings to do well on the Foundations to 1200 Unit Test	These terms will show up on the Foundations to 1200 Unit Test as part of questions or answers
